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**A BILL**

To amend title 18, United States Code, to discontinue the collection by the Federal Government of transaction records of discontinued firearms or ammunition businesses, to require the destruction of records already collected, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2 This Act may be cited as the “No Retaining Every  
3 Gun In a System That Restricts Your Rights Act” or “No  
4 REGISTRY Rights Act”.

5 **SEC. 2. DESTRUCTION OF BUREAU OF ALCOHOL, TOBACCO,  
6 FIREARMS, AND EXPLOSIVES FIREARM  
7 TRANSACTION RECORDS OF DISCONTINUED  
8 FIREARMS BUSINESSES.**

9 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 90 days after the  
10 date of enactment of this Act, the Director of the Bureau  
11 of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives shall de-  
12 stroy any record required to be kept under chapter 44 of  
13 title 18, United States Code, and delivered to the Attorney  
14 General under section 923(g)(4) of title 18, United States  
15 Code.

16 (b) PREVENTING FUTURE RETENTION OF FIREARMS  
17 OR AMMUNITION BUSINESS RECORDS.—Section  
18 923(g)(4) of title 18, United States Code, is amended by  
19 striking the second and third sentences.

20 **SEC. 3. REPORT TO CONGRESS.**

21 Not later than 90 days after the date of enactment  
22 of this Act, the Director of the Bureau of Alcohol, To-  
23 bacco, Firearms, and Explosives shall submit to Congress  
24 a written report that specifies the number of records de-  
25 stroyed under section 2(a).
